RESOLUTION OF THE HIALEAH HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD RECOMMENDING THE STREET NAMING AT WEST 12th AVENUE/NW 67th AVENUE FROM WEST 84th STREET/NW 138th STREET/STATE ROAD 916 TO WEST 82nd STREET AS "CARLOS OLIVA WAY", WITH THE COST OF SIGNAGE TO BE PAID BY THE CITY, IN HIS HONOR, AS A CUBAN AMERICAN AND A RESIDENT OF HIALEAH WHO STARTED "LOS SOBRINOS DEL JUEZ".

WHEREAS, the street naming at West 12th Avenue/NW 67th Avenue from West 84th Street/NW 138th Street/State Road 916 to West 82nd Street Hialeah, Florida as "Carlos Oliva Way" is in Honor of Carlos Oliva who emigrated in 1961 from Cuba, then to the City of Hialeah, where he formed his own band, "Los Sobrinos del Juez", (The Judge's Nephews); and;

WHEREAS, Carlos Oliva was born in Sancti-Spiritus, Cuba, where at a very early age he discovered and began cultivating his musical talent; and

WHEREAS, the popularity of Carlos Oliva and Los Sobrinos del Juez grew as they created a new, inter-cultural sound-a fusion of Cuban music, salsa, afro beats, samba, jazz and rock known as "The Miami Sound"; and

WHEREAS, Time Magazine credits Carlos Oliva as the pioneer of this popular and unique musical sound, which he and his group soon began showcasing in Las Vegas, Latin America, and Europe, among other venues; and

WHEREAS, Carlos has produced and directed other musical groups, including Miami Sound Machine, and has recorded numerous successful compositions as well as written compositions for other international artists; and

WHEREAS, he has also written theme songs for television shows like "Cristina" and "Ocurrio Asi"-both winners of BMI Latin TV Theme Awards-as well as "La Feria de la Alegria" and many others, in addition to writing music for over one hundred radio and television commercials; and

WHEREAS, winner of an Emmy Award for his musical work on a promotional Univision Campaign, Carlos Oliva is a symbol of creativity, talent and hard work, and is greatly respected both here locally as well as internationally; and

WHEREAS, Carlos Oliva and Los Sobrinos del Juez continue to share their distinctive and vibrant sound all over of the world, with notable appearances in Latin America, Europe and Brazil; and

WHEREAS, Carlos has represented Miami year after year in the world renowned festival "Calle 8", of which he was founder-associate as a member of the Kiwanis Club of Little Havana; and

WHEREAS, additionally, he and his group have performed at numerous events throughout South Florida over the years, including Viva Broward, El Carnaval Latino de New Orleans, Carnavales de Panama, La Parada de los Reyes Magos, and the Orange Bowl Parade; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor Carlos Oliva and his contributions to the community by codesignating, along with Miami-Dade County, that portion of W 12th Avenue/NW 67th Avenue from W 84th Street/NW 138th Street/State Road 916 to W 82nd Street as "Carlos Oliva Way"; and

WHEREAS, that portion of W 12th Avenue/NW 67th Avenue from W 84th Street/NW 138th Street/State Road 916 to W 82nd Street is a County-maintained road located in the City of Hialeah; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 13.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HIALEAH HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD THAT:

Section 1. The Board codesignates that portion of W 12th Avenue/NW 67th Avenue from W 84th Street/NW 138th Street/State Road 916 to W 82nd Street as "Carlos Oliva Way."

Section 2. The Board directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Mayor and Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners.





RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING, BY A THREE-FIFTHS VOTE OF BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT, THAT PORTION OF W 12TH AVENUE/NW 67TH AVENUE FROM W 84TH STREET/NW 138TH STREET/STATE ROAD 916 TO W 82ND STREET AS "CARLOS OLIVA WAY"; URGING THE CITY OF HIALEAH TO JOIN IN THIS CODESIGNATION

WHEREAS, "The Miami Sound" Carlos Oliva was born in Sancti-Spiritus, Cuba, where at a very early age he discovered and began cultivating his musical talent; and

WHEREAS, in 1961 Carlos arrived in Miami, where he quickly began making a name for himself as a percussionist and fine vocalist until he formed his own band, Los Sobrinos del Juez, (The Judge's Nephews); and

WHEREAS, the popularity of Carlos Oliva and Los Sobrinos del Juez grew as they created a new, inter-cultural sound—a fusion of Cuban music, salsa, afro beats, samba, jazz and rock; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 13; and

WHEREAS, Rule 9.02(d) of the Board's Rules of Procedure provides that the Commission may by a three-fifths vote of Board members present name a County road, facility or property after a living individual who has not served as an elected official within the past five years and who "has made a direct, significant lifetime contribution to this community,"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this resolution and the Board finds that Carlos Oliva has made direct, significant lifetime contributions to this community pursuant to Rule 9.02(d).

Section 2. Having considered this matter at a public hearing and by a three-fifths vote of Board members present, the Board codesignates that portion of W 12th Avenue/NW 67th Avenue from W 84th Street/NW 138th Street/State Road 916 to W 82nd Street as "Carlos Oliva Way."

Section 3. The Board urges the City of Hialeah to join in this codesignation.

Section 4. The Board directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hialeah, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Hialeah Police Department, and the Hialeah Fire Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner **Esteban L. Bovo, Jr.**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **José "Pepe" Diaz** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
