NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
HOME AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) USE OF FUNDS

NOTICE is given that the City of Hialeah will hold a public hearing to discuss the use of funds for HOME ARP funds to be received from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

To assist communities with persons experiencing homelessness, at-risk of homelessness and other vulnerable populations, Congress appropriated ARP funds to be administered through the HOME program to perform specific housing and supportive service activities that would benefit these populations. The City of Hialeah’s proposed use of funds include administration of HOME ARP funds, rental housing activities by the City and the Hialeah Housing Authority (HHA), and supportive services to qualifying populations under HOME ARP. For Hialeah, the qualifying population targeted is predominantly “at-risk of housing instability”.

COH Rental Housing (Acquisition, construct, rehab) & Supportive Services*	\$2,080,299

Note*: Anticipated allocations are contingent upon bids received and the actual cost at the time of award.

PUBLIC HEARING: The public hearing to discuss the use of funds for HOME ARP funds will be held at the regularly scheduled City Council meeting on **September 28, 2021 beginning at 7:00 PM**. These meetings are open to the public and are held in the Council Chambers, third floor of City Hall, 501 Palm Avenue, Hialeah, Florida 33010. Citizens are invited to attend and provide feedback and comments. Written comments shall be accepted by the Grants and Human Services Department from September 20, 2021 through October 08, 2021.
