

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-005

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, REAFFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF INGRID CAMINO-HERNANDEZ AS A MEMBER OF THE DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PLAN COMMITTEE, AS THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES' ("AFSCME") APPOINTMENT.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2014-128, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Hialeah established the seven (7) member Defined Contribution Plan Committee, whose purpose is to administer and monitor the City of Hialeah Defined Contribution Plans, with four (4) members appointed by the Mayor and three (3) members appointed by the unions, subject to confirmation by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2019-151, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Hialeah streamlined the composition of the Defined Contribution Plan Committee by reducing the number of the members in the committee to five (5), with two (2) members appointed by the Mayor and three (3) members appointed by the unions, subject to confirmation by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees' ("AFSCME") nominee is Ingrid Camino-Hernandez.






