

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-017

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE PLACEMENT OF PROPERTY INSURANCE THROUGH THE SERVICES OF ARTHUR J. GALLAGHER RISK MANAGEMENT SERVICES, INC., AN ILLINOIS CORPORATION, TO INSURE CITY PROPERTY, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, BUILDINGS, CONTENTS, PROPERTY, EQUIPMENT, AND VEHICLES, FOR AN ANNUAL PREMIUM OF \$604,448 COMMENCING ON MARCH 10, 2018 AND EXPIRING ON MARCH 10, 2019 THROUGH LAYERED INSURANCE COVERAGE WITH FOR A COMBINED AND TOTAL MAXIMUM LOSS LIMIT OF \$25 MILLION AGAINST DAMAGES CAUSED BY NATURAL DISASTERS AND \$25 MILLION AGAINST DAMAGES CAUSED BY ALL OTHER PERILS, AND A 5% DEDUCTIBLE FOR A NAMED WINDSTORM AND HAIL STORM, SUBJECT TO A \$250,000.00 DEDUCTIBLE; PLACING REQUIRED FLOOD COVERAGE ON NECESSARY PROPERTIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NATIONAL FLOOD PROGRAM AT APPROPRIATE RENEWAL PERIODS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has a longstanding valuable relationship with Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc. for property insurance coverage at marketable rates; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Hialeah, Fla. Resolution 11-16 (Feb. 21, 2011) Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc. was selected as the lowest responsive bidder in a competitive selective process advertised by the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City, after diligent search and inquiry, finds that the insurance costs offered are substantially less than the cost of comparable coverage for other local governments and public entities in Miami-Dade, Broward and Monroe Counties; and,

WHEREAS, because of the timing and long-standing relationships with the various insurance companies providing coverage, the insurance costs, represents a reasonably low rate, and,

WHEREAS, the City of Hialeah finds it in its best interest to renew insurance coverage through Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc. for an additional year as a continuation of service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:

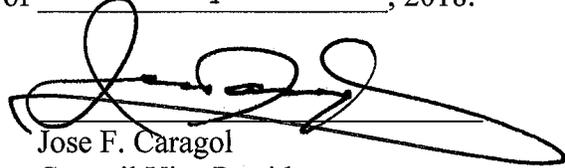
Section 1: The foregoing facts and recitations contained in the preamble to this resolution are hereby incorporated and adopted by reference as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2: The Mayor and the City Council of the City of Hialeah, Florida hereby authorize the placement of property insurance through the services of Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, Inc., an Illinois corporation, to insure city property including, but not limited to, buildings, contents, property, equipment and vehicles, for an annual premium of \$604,448 commencing on March 10, 2018 and expiring on March 10, 2019 through layered insurance coverage for a combined and total maximum loss limit of \$25 million against damages caused by natural disasters and \$25 million against damages caused by all other perils, and a 5% deductible for a named windstorm and hail storm, subject to a \$250,000.00 deductible and to place City's required flood coverage on necessary properties in accordance with the National Flood Program at appropriate renewal periods.

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Section 3: This resolution shall become effective when passed by the City Council and signed by the Mayor or at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting, if the Mayor's signature is withheld or if the City Council overrides the Mayor's veto.

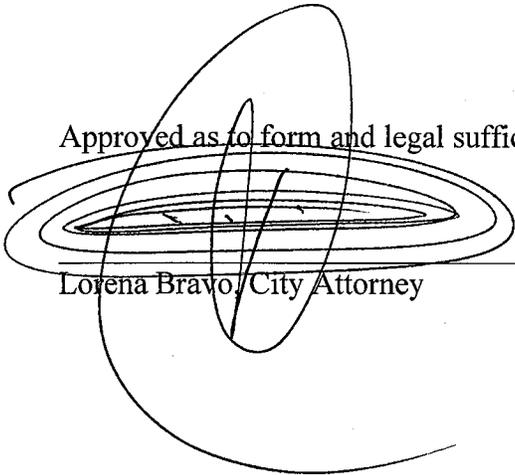
