

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-023

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL APPROVING THE NAMING OF THE FIRE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING LOCATED AT 83 EAST 5th STREET HIALEAH, FLORIDA, AS “CHIEF HERMINIO LORENZO FIRE ADMINISTRATION BUILDING”, IN HONOR OF HIS OUTSTANDING SERVICE AS THE FIRST CUBAN AMERICAN FIRE CHIEF IN THE CITY OF HIALEAH, WITH THE COST OF SIGNAGE TO BE PAID BY THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Board recommended approval of this Resolution on March 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the naming of the Fire Administration Building Located at 83 East 5th Street Hialeah, Florida, as “Chief Herminio Lorenzo Fire Administration Building”, is in Honor of the outstanding service of Chief Herminio as the first Cuban American Fire Chief in the City of Hialeah, and as a resident of the City; and

WHEREAS, Chief Herminio is a U.S. military airborne infantry combat wounded veteran purple heart recipient who was hired by the City of Hialeah as a firefighter, and advanced in rank through the years to Fire Chief; and


WHEREAS, Chief Herminio had achieved a Class I Public Protection rating by the Insurance Services Office, namely superior in property fire protection; and

WHEREAS, Chief Herminio was instrumental in getting the Fire Administration Building built, including the training facility, and modernized the fire service with a concentration in wellness and education.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:






