

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-061

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND APPROVING A MASTER SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN HARRIS CORPORATION AND THE CITY OF HIALEAH, TO PROVIDE MAINTENANCE AND TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO THE EMERGENCY SERVICES RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM DESIGNED AND INSTALLED PURSUANT TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH HARRIS CORPORATION APPROVED CONCURRENTLY WITH THIS RESOLUTION; FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS BEGINNING UPON THE EXPIRATION OF THE WARRANTY PERIOD UPON FINAL SYSTEM ACCEPTANCE, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,159,828.00, IN SUBSTANTIAL CONFORMITY WITH THE AGREEMENT ATTACHED HERETO AND MADE A PART HEREOF AS EXHIBIT "1"; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE CITY CLERK, AS ATTESTING WITNESS, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY TO EXECUTE THE MASTER SERVICES AGREEMENT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Hialeah, Florida, wishes to contract the services of a qualified company to make necessary upgrades to the City's public safety radio system to increase the City's network coverage and spectrum efficiency, improve the City's entire communication network while meeting the current and future communication needs of the City associated with public safety; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Hialeah Code Section 2-818, if advantageous to the City, the City may utilize bids that have been awarded or under contract by other governmental agencies, in which case competitive bidding will not be required;

WHEREAS, the City of Miami issued Request for Proposals No. 592382 on May 16, 2016 ("the RFP"), for the provision of an 800 MHz P25 Digital Trunked Simulcast Network System, and after evaluating the responders' qualifications and competitive proposals, awarded the contract to Harris Corporation;

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is advantageous to use the City of Miami's competitively procured contract with Harris Corporation and contract with Harris Corporation on terms and conditions consistent with the City of Miami's competitively procured contract to acquire an 800 MHz Digital Trunked Simulcast Network System;

WHEREAS, Harris Corporation has the experience and capability to provide the City with an 800 MHz P25 Digital Trunked Simulcast Network System and all necessary related services to install, maintain and service the City's radio system;

WHEREAS, engaging Harris to maintain the system, including providing for spare and replacement parts, once the System has been accepted and after the expiration of the warranty period, is in the best interest of the public as the most cost-effective means to ensure the System operates in good working order and at its highest operating efficiency and functionality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the Master Services Agreement with Harris Corporation as provided for by this Resolution is in the best interest of the public and will protect the public's health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:


Section 1: The foregoing facts and recitations contained in the preamble to this resolution are hereby incorporated and adopted by reference as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2: The City of Hialeah, Florida hereby waives competitive bidding, and approves a Master Services Agreement between Harris Corporation and the City of Hialeah, to provide maintenance and technical support to the City's emergency services radio communications system designed and installed pursuant to a Professional Services Agreement with Harris approved concurrently with this Resolution, for a term of three years beginning upon the expiration of the warranty period and after final system acceptance, with an option to renew for an additional two years, in a total amount not to exceed \$1,159,828.00.

Section 3: The City Council hereby approves the terms of the Master Services Agreement, in substantial conformity with the agreement attached hereto and made a part hereof as "Exhibit 1", and hereby authorizes the Mayor and the City Clerk, as attesting witness, to sign the Master Services Agreement on behalf of the City.




