

RESOLUTION NO.: 2013-77

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE EXPENDITURE TOTALING AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$6,762.50 FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND - *FEDERAL*, TO PURCHASE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) RING BUOYS AND ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (150) RESCUE THROW ROPES FOR THE HIALEAH POLICE DEPARTMENT, FROM LINCOLN EQUIPMENT, INC., LOWEST QUOTE VENDOR, UPON SUCH COSTS HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

WHEREAS, the Hialeah Police Department faces potential life-saving situations on a daily basis; and

WHEREAS, the ring buoys and rescue throw ropes have been a reliable method to assist an officer in saving lives when citizens have fallen into a canal; and

WHEREAS, the ring buoys and throw ropes are simple tools that will be equipped in the Hialeah Police Department police units; and

WHEREAS, use of ring buoys and rescue throw ropes to save citizen lives will reduce potential lawsuits against the City; and

WHEREAS, the funds to cover these necessary and legitimate expenses are available in the Law Enforcement Trust Fund - *Federal*; and


WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended adoption of this resolution and determined that the proposed expenditure complies with the provisions of the *Guide To Equitable Sharing*.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor and the City Council of the City of Hialeah, Florida, approve the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$6,762.50, from the Law Enforcement

Trust Fund – *Federal*, to purchase ring buoys and rescue throw ropes, upon such costs having been approved by the Chief of Police.






