RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE EXPENDITURE TOTALING AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FORTY TWO THOUSAND TWENTY DOLLARS (\$42,020.00) FROM THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND - *FEDERAL*, TO PURCHASE 20 LENOVO THINKPAD T480 LAPTOP COMPUTERS AND APPLICABLE WARRANTIES FROM LENOVO, INC., AN AUTHORIZED DISTRIBUTOR, UTILIZING FLORIDA NASPO VALUEPOINT CONTRACT NO. MNWNC-117/43211500-WSCA-15-ACS, AND 20 BROTHER RUGGEDJET RJ-4230BL LABEL PRINTERS, RELATED ACCESSORIES, AND EXTENDED MAINTENANCE PLANS FROM CDW COMPUTER CENTERS, LLC (GOVERNMENT DIVISION), AN AUTHORIZED DISTRIBUTOR, UTILIZING NATIONAL IPA TECHNOLOGY SOLUTIONS CONTRACT NO. 2018011-01, AND WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING AS IT IS ADVANTAGEOUS TO THE CITY, UPON SUCH COSTS HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

WHEREAS, the Hialeah Police Department utilizes mobile laptop computers and printers in its patrol cars to handle tasks such as issuing and printing citations and scribing and printing reports in the field, thus significantly reducing administrative time spent at a police station;

WHEREAS, in order to continue to enhance this program and ensure outstanding service, rapid response, crime prevention, and security, the Hialeah Police Department seeks to purchase durable, fast, high quality laptop computers and rugged printers for its patrol vehicle fleet; and

WHEREAS, outfitting Hialeah Police Department patrol vehicles with state of the art, field reliable mobile laptop computers and printers allow law enforcement officers to increase the timely sharing of information from the field to the citizen and court system as well as improving time spent at calls for service and assisting the community; and

WHEREAS, competitive procurement and terms and pricing for the laptop computers and printers has been obtained through the State of Florida Naspo ValuePoint Contract No. MNWNC-117/43211500-WSCA-15-ACS and the National IPA Technology Solutions Contract No. 2018011-01, respectively, and it is in the best interest of the City to waive competitive bidding to approve the expenditure of funds; and

WHEREAS, the funds to cover these necessary and legitimate expenses are available in the Law Enforcement Trust Fund - *Federal*; and


WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended adoption of this resolution and determined that the proposed expenditure complies with the *Guide to Equitable Sharing*.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:


Section 1. The Mayor and the City Council of the City of Hialeah, Florida, approve the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$40,020.00 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund – *Federal*, for the purchase of 20 Lenovo ThinkPad T480 laptop computers and applicable warranties from Lenovo, Inc., an authorized distributor, utilizing State of Florida Naspo ValuePoint Contract No. MNWNC-117/43211500-WSCA-15-ACS, and 20 Brother RuggedJet RJ-4230BL Label Printers, related accessories, and extended maintenance plans from CDW Computer Centers, LLC (Government Division), an authorized distributor, utilizing National IPA Technology Solutions Contract No. 2018011-01, and waiving competitive bidding as it is advantageous to the City, upon such costs having been approved by the Chief of Police.

Section 2: This resolution shall become effective when approved by majority vote of the City Council and signed by the Mayor or at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting, if the Mayor's signature is withheld or if the City Council overrides the Mayor's veto.




