

RESOLUTION 2020-004

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, APPOINTING **ELIZABETH GARCIA** TO THE CULTURAL AFFAIRS COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH FOR A (2)-YEAR TERM ENDING ON JANUARY 14, 2022.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 2-641 of the Code of the City of Hialeah, there is created a cultural affairs council as a governmental agency of the city government. The Cultural Affairs Council is vested with the power, advise the city council on significant and pertinent matters relating to cultural activities and events that impact or originate within the city, promote and encourage public participation in cultural and fine arts activities, events and exhibitions, and promote, attract and obtain public and private sponsorship of cultural and fine arts activities, events and exhibitions, under the direct jurisdiction and legislative control of the City Council.

WHEREAS, the cultural affairs council shall consist of eight members. Each councilmember and the mayor shall select a member. Members shall serve without compensation. Members shall serve for a term of two years.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 4.07.(d) all members of appointive or elective boards of the city shall be resident electors.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 5.01 any person who is a resident of the city, has qualified as a Florida elector and registers to vote in the manner prescribed by law shall be an elector of the city.

WHEREAS, the term of office shall be for two years for each member.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: Elizabeth Garcia is hereby appointed to the Cultural Affairs Council of the City of Hialeah, Florida, for a two (2)-year term ending on January 14, 2022
