

**RESOLUTION NO. 2016-99**

RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA CONFIRMING AND APPROVING THE ANNUAL CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) ADJUSTMENT OF WATER AND SEWER RATES PURSUANT TO HIALEAH CODE § 94-153(c), IN THE AMOUNT OF 1% DESIGNATED "CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS (CPI)" AS PUBLISHED BY THE BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS.

**WHEREAS**, the City finds that it is in the best interest to recoup and defray the increases that the City will continue to pay Miami-Dade County for the purchase of its water and the disposal of its wastewater through a CPI increase to rates as provided herein; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Hialeah, Fla., Ordinance 06-45 (Aug. 23, 2006), the City of Hialeah revised the Hialeah Code to provide for an annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment of water and sewer rates as determined by the amount of the annual increase in the index numbers of retail commodity prices designated "Consumer Price Index For All Urban Consumers (CPI) as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:

**Section 1:** The City of Hialeah, Florida hereby confirms and approves the annual Consumer Price Index (CPI) adjustment of water and sewer rates pursuant to Hialeah Code § 94-153(c), in the amount of 1% designated "Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI)" as published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

**Section 2: Effective date.**

This resolution shall become effective when passed by the City Council and signed by the Mayor or at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting, if the Mayor's signature is withheld or if the City Council overrides the Mayor's veto.




