RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, APPOINTING **JASMINE MARTINEZ** TO THE YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH FOR A (2)-YEAR TERM ENDING ON JUNE 15, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Youth Advisory Board of the City of Hialeah is vested with the powers and duties of advising the City Council on significant and pertinent matters relating to young people within the City, reporting and advising the City Council on the needs, goals, objectives and results of activities relating to young persons in the community, representing the City and its interests in any county, state or national initiatives, programs, boards and committees concerning young people, promoting sports, cultural activities and community projects for young people in the community, educating young people in exercising their rights and privileges under law and their civic duty and responsibilities, and educating young people concerning the function of the legislative, executive and judicial branches of government as it pertains to young people and adults.

WHEREAS, the Youth Advisory Board shall consist of eight members between the ages of 15 and 21 years.

WHEREAS, each councilmember and the Mayor shall select a member.


WHEREAS, Councilmember Carl Zogby nominated Jasmine Martinez as his appointment to the Youth Advisory Board of the City of Hialeah.

WHEREAS, the term of office for each member shall be two years.




