ORDINANCE GRANTING A VARIANCE PERMIT TO ALLOW CONSTRUCTION OF A SINGLE FAMILY HOME ON EACH THREE SUBSTANDARD-SIZED LOTS HAVING A WIDTH OF 40 FEET, MORE OR LESS, WHERE A MINIMUM AVERAGE WIDTH OF 75 FEET IS REQUIRED, A TOTAL AREA OF 5,400 SQUARE FEET, MORE OR LESS, WHERE A TOTAL AREA OF AT LEAST 7,500 SQUARE FEET IS REQUIRED AND A CORNER SIDE SETBACK OF 5.08 WHERE **FEET** FEET. 15 ARE REQUIRED, TO HIALEAH CONTRA CODE §§ 98-499 AND 98-501. PROPERTY LOCATED AT 501 EAST 13 STREET, HIALEAH, FLORIDA. REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION HEREOF; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board at its meeting of October 9, 2013, recommended approval of this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: The below-described property is hereby granted a variance permit to allow construction of a single-family home on each of three substandard-sized lots having a width of 40 feet, more or less, where an average width of 75 feet is required, and a total area of 5,400 square feet, more or less, where a total area of at least 7,500 square feet is required, and a corner side setback of 5.08 feet, where 15 feet are required, contra to Hialeah Code §§ 98-499 and 98-501, which provide in pertinent part: "The minimum building site in the R-1 one-family district shall be one lot or parcel of land containing at

least 7,500 square feet of area for each one-family. Such parcels or lots shall have an average width of at least 75 feet and shall also have a minimum average depth of 100 feet." and "For a corner lot, the side yard parallel abutting the street shall be not less than 15 feet." Property located at 501 West 13 Street, Hialeah, Miami-Dade County, Florida and legally described as follows:

LOTS 28, 29, 30 AND THE SOUTH 6 FEET OF THE 12-FOOT ALLEY LYING NORTH AND ADJACENT THERETO CLOSED PURSUANT TO CITY OF HIALEAH, FLORIDA ORDINANCE 97-107 (JAN. 24, 1994), IN BLOCK 15-E, OF EIGHTH ADDITION TO THE TOWN OF HIALEAH, ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 9, AT PAGE 11, OF THE PUBLIC RECORDS OF MIAMIDADE COUNTY, FLORIDA

Section 2: Repeal of Ordinances in Conflict.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 3: Penalties.

Every person violating any provision of the Code or any ordinance, rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof shall be assessed a civil penalty not to exceed \$500.00 within the discretion of the court or administrative tribunal having jurisdiction. Each act of violation and each day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. In addition to the penalty prescribed above, the city may pursue other remedies such as abatement of nuisance, injunctive relief, administrative adjudication and revocation of licenses or permits.

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Section 4: Severability Clause.

If any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared invalid or unconstitutional by the judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this ordinance.

Section 5: Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective when passed by the City Council and signed by the Mayor or at the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting, if the Mayor's signature is withheld or if the City Council overrides the Mayor's veto.
